

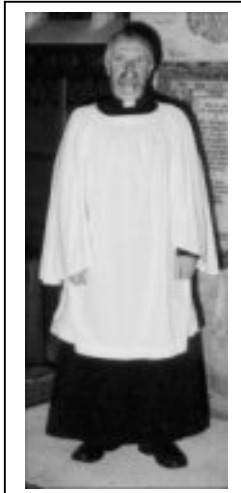
What does the Vicar wear?



1) First the Vicar puts on a long black coat, called a cassock.



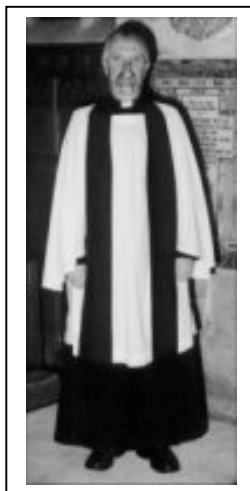
4) When wearing the black scarf, the vicar may also wear a hood.



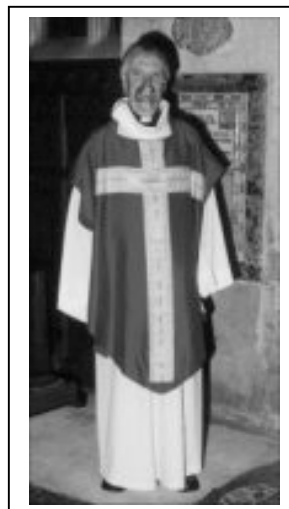
2) This is the surplice, or white linen over garment. The Vicar wears this at morning and evening services, and some also wear it for Holy Communion. Round his neck he wears a clerical or Roman collar.



5) For Holy Communion, some vicars wear an alb instead of a cassock and surplice. This is a long white linen garment tied round the middle. On top is a coloured stole.



3) Over the surplice the vicar wears a long black scarf, or for Holy Communion, a coloured stole or chasuble.



6) Over the alb and stole the vicar will wear a special coloured chasuble. The stole and chasuble are a special colour according to the season of the church's year.
